Dr. Roberts is a graduate of The Ohio State University (OSU), earning a bachelor's degree in microbiology and a Doctor of Dental Surgery (DDS) at the OSU College of Dentistry. At the Eastman Dental Center at the University of Rochester in New York, he completed residency programs in general dentistry and orthodontics, as well as a research fellowship, earning a certificate in orthodontics a Master of Science in dental research. He sold his private practice in Findlay, Ohio in 2017.

Dr. Roberts is an adjunct associate professor of dentistry at the University of Michigan,
Department of Orthodontics and Pediatric Dentistry, and has for many years been involved with

several student research projects. The University of Michigan Orthodontic Alumni Association conferred upon him an honorary membership.

The author of several peer-reviewed articles published in orthodontic and dental journals, and a past president of the GLAO, Dr. Roberts has been actively involved in volunteer leadership roles professionally and in his community. He has held the presidencies of the Ohio Association of Orthodontists (OAO), the Hancock County Dental Society, and the Blanchard Valley Dental Study Club and is currently a member of the Board of Directors of the AAO Insurance Company. He is the co-director of the Graduate Orthodontic Residents Program, which sponsors an annual meeting of orthodontic residents from the U.S. and Canada to acquaint them with counterparts from coast-to-coast, introduce them to organized orthodontics, and meet representatives of companies that serve orthodontists' practice needs.

In addition to memberships in the AAO, GLAO and OAO, Dr. Roberts' other professional memberships include the World Federation of Orthodontists, the American Dental Association, the Ohio Dental Association and the Northwestern Ohio Dental Association. Locally, he has served as president of the Findlay Rotary Club, as the dental representative of the Findlay/Hancock County Community Development Foundation, as the dental division captain of the United Way of Hancock County, and as a Eucharistic minister at Saint Michael the Archangel Catholic Church in Findlay. He is a former dental staff member at Blanchard Valley Regional Hospital in Findlay.

A runner in his spare time, Dr. Roberts has completed the Boston Marathon 19 times.

Dr. Roberts and his wife, Susan, are residents of Findlay. They are parents of two adult children, Dr. Brian Roberts, an emergency medicine physician in New York City and Captain Sarah Roberts Zerr, a former Marine Corps helicopter pilot, and are grandparents of three.
