The American Board of Orthodontics (ABO) is proud that 61% of the American Association of Orthodontists (AAO) are now board certified! Board certification continues to set the standard of care for the specialty. We are leading the way - together!

### Future Examination Dates Announced

- <u>Written Examination</u>: The 2024 Written Exam will be held on April 2. The exam will be administered at Pearson-Vue Centers in the United States and Canada.
- <u>Scenario-based Clinical Examination</u>: The 2024 Clinical Examinations will be administered February 22-23 (*registration for this exam is FULL*) and September 17 (registration now open). The examinations will be held at Pearson-Vue Centers Worldwide. Beginning in 2025, the ABO will transition to one fall Scenario-based Clinical Examination per year.

### **Certification Renewal Reminder**

ABO certification renewal is an important component of the board certification process. Successful completion of the examination is required every 10 years to maintain an active board certification status. Board-certified orthodontists are notified 3 years prior to the expiration date printed on their certificate that they are eligible to take the Certification Renewal Examination. You have two options to renew, including an Online Board Case Exam or a Mail-In Case Report Exam, along with completing continuing education credits from four online AJODO examinations. Online materials are available to prepare for the Certification Renewal Examination and include a Study Guide with FAQs, and a video, summarizing the process.

# **AAO Council Featured Reports**

### AAO Council on Orthodontic Practice Update

The Council on Orthodontic Practice met for its annual meeting in St. Louis on December 9, 2023. Here is a synopsis of projects and subcommittees within the council:

**Office Design**: COOP is recommending to the BOT for ongoing funding to keep content for the AAO's Office Design Series updated and relevant-Ongoing

**Sustainability:** In Summer 2023, COOP formed a sustainability subcommittee. Dr. Goodman reported progress to date.

Based on Dr. Goodman's report out, COOP unanimously agreed that there is a need to implement sustainability efforts based on the volume of product creation and waste with 3D printing and clear aligners.

The COOP subcommittee was introduced to representatives at Terracycle through Mindi Brothers who had spoken to Terracycle in previous years regarding a potential member benefit initiative. (<u>https://www.terracycle.com/en-US</u>) They are the leader and the best equipped vendor to provide a program such as this.

A multi-step initiative was shared and formalized to include (1) a volunteer recycling program to include recycling clear aligner trays, 3D print materials, PPE, plastic packaging, and office supplies. With project management, reporting and aid with promotional content from Terracycle\*. (2) A member wide volunteer program similar to MASO's "Go Green" effort. (https://maso.org/go-green/) giving offices the option to take a pledge to stop using plastic bags with AAO providing an initial shipment of 50 free paper bags and resources to purchase future bags. (3) New member sustainability webpage providing information on items 1 & 2, as well as updates on sustainability efforts and custom-designed downloadable resources for members to use in their practices. (4) A sustainability page on our public facing AAO website detailing AAO and members sustainability efforts. -Phase one completion is three years from

start date.

## AAO Council on Membership, Ethics and Judicial Concerns Update

### **HOD Resolutions**

- COMEJC is submitting resolutions to the 2024 AAO House of Delegates to propose the following:
  - Implement a trial membership for orthodontists who are eligible for Active Membership and have never been AAO members previously, except for those who have been Student Members. If approved, the program would be implemented on a pilot basis for four years.

- Extend the international bulk membership dues pilot by one year. This pilot, which is scheduled to end in May 2024, gives the Board of Trustees authority to negotiate and approve bulk dues amounts with international orthodontic societies.
- Amend Bylaws to remove outdated language regarding eligibility of International Members who relocate to the U.S. and Canada and teach full-time at an accredited orthodontic program.
- Amend Bylaws to more clearly define Retired Membership and eligibility.

# **Donated Orthodontic Services**



Since its inception more than a decade ago, the Donated Orthodontic Services (DOS) program has provided orthodontic treatment for over 1,000 children from families with a financial need. Today, our purpose remains the same - create opportunities for children to have access to professional orthodontic intervention through a volunteer network of AAO members.

DOS is a program of the American Association of Orthodontists Foundation (AAOF) that serves as a conduit to orthodontic treatment for children who lack access to care.

Through the DOS program, children receive help during a critical time in their development where bullying and self-esteem issues are prevalent. Ultimately, we want children to feel more confident as they move forward in life with their best smile.

### Why Serve as a Program Provider?

While some orthodontists choose to affiliate with similar outreach programs or seek-out pro bono cases on their own, doctors often decide to serve through DOS because the program takes all the guesswork out of volunteering.

- All applicants are vetted by the DOS Program Administrator who handles the behind-the-scenes components of the process. Note, additional criteria, such as proof of a Medicaid denial, can also be added to the vetting process to meet the specific policies of your practice.
- Applicant families are required to show proof of financial need and each child must be evaluated by their general dentist.
- Volunteers decide how many cases per year to accept, and always have the final say when it comes to accepting a new case for treatment.
